#### Head and Hands in Clay course offered by Katharine Schmidt

Most people feel frustrated when they try to incorporate the human head or hands into their pottery and ceramic sculpture. We will cover the basics of constructing these difficult sculptural elements and incorporating them into garden sculpture, decorative planters, and masks.



The class will start with slab construction of a proportional head, neck, and shoulders in clay. Then we learn the secrets of making eyes, mouths, nose, and ears followed by details on making hands, hair, and adding decorative touches and texture. Some experience with hand building is helpful but not required.

# January Speaker Patty Roberts

"The purpose of art is to bring order and beauty into the uncertainties of life."

Rev. Dr. Patty Roberts is a life-long artist and retired Ordained Elder of the United Methodist Church. As a hospice chaplain and Director of Spiritual Care at Marianjoy Rehabilitation Hospital in Wheaton, IL, Patty incorporated art as a means of healing and spiritual insight in various approaches for patients, families and staff. Since retiring she has pursued a passion for abstract painting, particularly in the medium of oil and cold wax, which she describes as "mesmerizing, intuitive painting." The pandemic, accompanied by profound personal loss, influenced her work deeply. Not only did art become a survival mechanism, it became her "uninhibited attempt to make sense of what cannot be understood rationally." Love of family, spiritual connection, expression of grief, the urge to bring order to chaos all are expressed in her painting.

Her work in the last two years reflects her belief that "spiritual grounding, deep introspection, creativity, and community are more important than ever in order to bring about the healing of our society and planet." Her process is intuitive, introspective, following her first teacher's advice, "I am not so much searching for an image, as I am for a feeling."



Patty has recently exhibited at the Marshall J. Gardner Art Center in Miller Beach, the Towle Theater in Hammond, and the Chesterton Art Fair. She has been accepted to the "One of a Kind Art Fair" at the Merchandise Mart in Chicago this coming April..
