Patty Roberts Cold Wax Workshop September 15

Patty Roberts is offering a second cold wax and oil abstract workshop September 15.

Date/Time: Sunday, September 15, 2024, 11:30am – 4:30pm

Location: Pinhook Park Community Building, 2801 Riverside Dr. South Bend, IN

Workshop Description: You will learn how to use oil paint along with the cold wax medium. Layer upon layer is applied, removed, scratched off or stamped on. Abstract art is about shapes, colors, proportion, symmetry, asymmetry, and surprise. Patty will show you the very basic techniques and your creative imagination will flow. This is a very intuitive style of painting allowing whatever happens to be part of the fun. You should wear clothing you don't mind getting paint on or wear an apron or a large shirt for over your clothes.

What to bring – Two foam core boards (available at Hobby Lobby, Michaels, or United Art and Education Store). These must be cut to 16" x 20" or purchased in that size. These will be used to tape your art paper down and serve as a way to transport your finished work.

All other supplies will be provided. If you wish to bring some of your own items, they could include oil paints, brayers, palette knives, used gift cards, or anything that could make a mark or scratch.

September Speaker Kay Westhues

Our presenter for our September General Meeting will be local, awardwinning photographer Kay Westhues. Kay will be talking about her new selfpublished photo book, "Out of Order". She will share her process of making a book and sharing some work from another series called "Mostly Indiana."

Kay was raised in Indiana and her art practice has been based in the Midwest for most of her life. She studied art at Rhode Island School of Design, and earned an MS in Instructional Systems Technology from Indiana University and an MA in Folk Studies from Western Kentucky University, Bowling Green, KY. Her work includes several long-term photography projects that incorporate video, sound, drawing, and ethnography.

Her art explores the ways in which rural tradition and history are understood, acted on, and recreated in everyday life. She approaches her projects with a sociological and narrative lens, and seeks not the most literal content but the most human and personal.
